In the first reading this weekend, we hear from the Book of Proverbs. These proverbs were written by King Solomon. You may recall that when he was young, Solomon asked God for wisdom and God gave it to him. King Solomon ruled the nation of Israel like his father King David for many years. In the Book of Proverbs, Solomon discusses questions of values, moral behaviors, the meaning of human life and right conduct. If we believe that God is creator and sustainer of all things. If we believe that God is eternal and knows all things, then it would make sense that a person would want to submit themselves to God's will and plan for their lives. Solomon in his writings is trying to teach us what wisdom truly is. 
