A Note from Father Francis Xavier

Role of A Mother

We read in the book of Proverbs 17:6," Grand Children are the crown of the elderly and the glory of children is their parents". This can be taken to mean that, the elderly can see their descendants but can imply also a call to live a life that makes children proud to be associated with their parents. Parents are thus encouraged to live a life of wisdom and righteousness so that children are proud of them and can wear their names and consequently carry on the legacy. In the same vein, parents are to raise their children in virtue and ensure family harmony.

As we move towards the close of the Marian month of August, I feel obliged to share with you beloved parents at least three traits from mother Mary; Trust, Selfless love, and Patience.

When Angel Gabriel announced to her that she will conceive of a child and even gave a name (Emmanuel) despite the challenges the pregnancy would cause—as a Judean girl, conceiving without marriage would attract a death sentence by being stoned, mother Mary trusted in God. As a couple, how do I respond if pregnancy occurs not according to our logical child-spacing plan or how do I look at those who (in my thinking seem to produce without planning?) GOD FORBID- what if it was your daughter???

Selfless love; recall her visitation to her elder cousin, immediately after hearing from angel Gabriel of the state of Elizabeth, she set out for the hills hastily yet she had just received astonishing news that she would bear the son of God! Mary puts down her own needs for the needs of others. Patience; Can you remember when she spent three days searching for her missing son. More so, at Cana of Galilee, when she asks her son for the need of wine and how in both instances Jesus made answers back? Mary had the wisdom, the patience and would never lose trust whenever His responses didn't made sense to her, rather "treasured all these things in her heart". More than any mother, Mary knew her son and trusted Him to use His capabilities to do good. Make efforts to always understand your child.

We need to be patient with our children as they may not always answer according to our expectations.

We need to encourage them to bring out the best in them as they grow.

We need to look beyond and incorporate the needs of others and strive to share what the lord is accomplishing in our lives—it can inspire.

If we seek to bring love to the world and have our names inscribed in the hearts of our children, let's look to Mary for inspiration and guidance.




