A Note from Father Francis Xavier

PURGATORY; A GIVE AND TAKE.

The CCC defined Purgatory as "Purification so as the souls to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. It is for those who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified". We as Christians, believe in praying to God to have the sins wholly blotted out for those who die believing in God though not perfect as we find in the book of 2Macc 12:41-45.

St. Faustina Kowlaska (diary 1226,20) encouraged people to pray for the souls in Purgatory, ".....in the morning and evening, visit cemeteries, attend Mass and offering Holy Communion as well as adopting a forgotten soul".

Relatedly, St. Alphonsus Maria de Liquori, encourages us "The blessed souls in purgatory are the Lords eternal spouses, and most grateful are they to those who obtain their deliverance from prison, or even a mitigation of their torments. When therefore, they arrive in heaven, they will be sure to remember all those who have prayed for them".

Today it is not surprising to hear many of us sharing passionately about the benefits of praying for souls. Back in the country (Uganda), a couple married for the last 33 years (now woman 53 and husband 62 years) never became pregnant and to make matters worse, to every hospital the woman went, was told she had Uterine abnormalities including but not limited to Fibroid tumors and Ovarian dysfunction. At one time, I was mobilizing for a pilgrimage to the grave site of our parish-founding pastor (a journey of 24 hours by bus) and gave out A novena prayer for 40 days that involved praying for father's Soul and other souls in purgatory and each participant was to add one specific personal need. The husband also participated with his need for a miracle (a child). After the pilgrimage (Feb-11th-2023), it is exciting that they have given birth to 5 children at once (though aided by Science).

Let us join the Pope for Nov prayer intention; For anyone who has lost a child. We pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter will find support in their community and receive peace and consolation from the Holy Spirit.


Prayers & Squares Ministry







Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you wanting to participate fully in the sacraments instituted by Christ? Are you a baptized Christian and desiring to
