



A Note from Father Mike

So, why do bad things happen to good people in our world? I think this question has been asked numerous times throughout history. We see a second hurricane hitting our country. I have lived through two hurricanes. First was Andrew in South Florida and the second was Fran that hit the central part of the Carolinas. Having trees falling on our home and having no power for days and days was not a pleasant time. Yet one thing I did notice, is that natural disasters happen to all types of people, the young and old, the good and the not so good. Natural disasters will bring out in people their true selves. Some will think only of themselves and start stealing, looting, killings, and many other crimes against the vulnerable. While others will live love of neighbor and come together out of love and compassion to help others and share what they have. When we see natural disasters especially hurricanes coming, it should move our hearts with love and compassion for God's children even more.

Often, people may only engage after the disaster has already happened, which is wonderful and helpful. Yet, how many people are proactive in truly loving their neighbors. Being proactive means praying for the people in the path of a storm. We should intercede for them by praying that a storm be lessened in strength, or that it may stay out at sea until it weakens, or that it would be directed to a lesser populated area. Remember what our Lord said, that strong faith can move mountains. How often we forget that strong faith can also move storms. I encourage all of our faith family here at St. Mary Magdalene to get on bended knee and through prayer intercede and battle against these natural disasters out of love for God and our neighbors.






