

A Note from Father Francis

Sometimes it sounds sarcastic to tell someone troubled that God is good. However, as a matter of fact God's unfathomable goodness can never be outweighed by whatever kind or type of causality. Otherwise, since time immemorial, humanity has been wracked with inexhaustible human suffering. Generation after generation; its war after war, political and civil crisis, intra and interpersonal conflicts- sometimes escalating into domestic conflicts and all it's ugly consequences, diseases and natural catastrophes. All these have coexisted alongside humanity yet God mysteriously sustains us in his goodness. I remember for example, those moments after the loss of my parents amid biting poverty yet expected to look for my own tuition and also take care of a very miserable young family. Today I stand to testify that **God is good.**

Child of God, what are you battling with that currently makes you feel humiliated or making you feel less; family or friends affected by Hurricane, struggling with broken relationships, employment challenges or personal failures....? We can still sing with **Horatio G Spafford**- an accomplished lawyer- of happy memories, who after losing his four daughters on a ship collision preceded by the death of his only son to pneumonia two years before and having lost his huge properties to Chicago fires still had the courage to write his song; IT IS WELL WITH MY SOUL?

Can I challenge you to pause for a few moments to refer to your bible and together pray Psalm 46? **God is good indeed.**

Abba Father, enlighten our minds to see the sufferings of our brothers and sisters and even when blurred by our own life challenges to see you and praise you. Amen.







Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you wanting to participate fully in the sacraments instituted by Christ? Are you a baptized Christian and desiring to




