

#### A Note from Father Mike

We have often heard scripture tell us, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends". As I was growing up, I often heard the words "friend" and "friendship". It caused me to ponder what they really mean. Not in a grammar sense, but how are they lived out in everyday life. Our American culture's use of the word "friend" is interesting. We often see people having 500, 1000, or even more "friends" on Facebook, or on other social media platforms. It seems we mix up the word "friend" for "follower". We may even view them as just synonyms. I think what most people call their friends are actually just acquaintances. People we see if it's convenient, maybe get together sometimes, but they are not a deep part of the rhythm of our life.

True friends, true friendships on the other hand, are just as entwined in our lives as a romantic partner or immediate family member might be. A true friend is one who is always by our side no matter what. They actually love us, both at our best and at our worst. If we are not happy for some reason or going through a difficult period in our life, they are there to support and encourage us. They do not disappear. If they have a problem with us, they communicate, and we try to find a solution together because we value the friendship and the bond we share. We feel like we can tell them anything literally without being ashamed or fearing that we will be judged. They love us and they tell us that or they show it through their actions. We feel like they are our family. We make plans together and memories.

Let us never forget, as we go through life, that God laid down his life for love of us. So, ponder his precious words of wisdom and love. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."




Are you an adult interested in becoming Catholic? Are you wanting to participate fully in the sacraments instituted by Christ? Are you a baptized Christian and desiring to


