

A Note from Father Francis Xavier

WE ARE GOD'S OWN

God calls Jeremiah and sends him to the Potter's house and ".....found the vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as seemed good to him......" (ref Jer 18: 1-6). God's sovereign power is expressed under the simile of a potter working in his pottery, and making and marring vessels at pleasure. God deals within us as a sovereign being, yet He acts both in a way that's kind and equitable, as the potter changes his work, so God does, He changes the dispensation of His providence. Once we submit ourselves to Him as His bride, He will in us break down any distortion and skillfully redesign or reshape our lives. This calls us to commit our lives to God early and open to His acts of grace at all times.

Moreover, God also, in His providence, keeps records of our earliest faithfulness and commitment. "I remember the devotion of your youth, your love as a bride, how you followed me in the wilderness, in the land not sown" (Jer 2:2b). Let us recall our Baptismal commitments and other commitments we ever made in our vocations and recommit ourselves to God. St. Pope John Paul II encourages us to let Christ into our lives 'If we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, nothing absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great.'

Pray with me: God bless the young people and all those who inspire them to live a life of commitment. Draw the young people to respond with the love of you in their daily struggles with life. Amen.

Update on the campaign: We gathered over 1,000 signatures from concerned community members in Apex, and have secured the support of the faith community representing more than 24,000 congregants in the area. But we need more pressure to push the Town Council to prevent displacement of our neighbors.

We need you to take action: Join us Tuesday, September 24 at 6:00pm at the Apex Town Council to show your support. We need as many supporters as possible to pack the Council chambers and ask the Town of Apex to demonstrate their commitment to its residents and our neighbors.

Why:

- Apex's mobile home parks are naturally occurring affordable housing that we must preserve. Apex voters have made it clear that affordable housing is a priority for our community.
- Mobile home park residents are our neighbors. They are long-time community members who make valuable contributions to our Town, including as essential workers and small business owners.
