A Note from Father Francis Xavier

NURTURE YOUR CHILD

It is a popular saying in my mother tongue that "A CHILD DOES NOT NURTURE ITSELF BUT NURTURED", let me hope, I am not being over presumptuous to hold that those of you reading this piece do know what NURTURING means. Allow me to make this observation before I can proceed; God in time, space and eternity plays three roles, that's CREATION (done and was finished), PROVIDENCE (Preservation and Governance-which on-going) AND REDEMPTION (Incarnation, and Deliverance-through the Passion, Death and Resurrection).

I want from the above, to look at NURTURING in line with God's role of Divine Providence. First of all, in Proverbs 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he/she should go, and when he/she is old he/she will not depart from it,' for God voices out also in Jerimiah 29:11- 'For I know well the plans I have for you...." and contrastingly Paul in his letter to Ephesians 6:1-3 reprimands "Children obey your parents in the Lord that it may go well with you and that you may have a long life on earth". Equally, it's no doubt, you all know that children are by birth (nature) born different and each one uniquely endowed.

The words I have spoken to you are of spirit and life". Let our words and skills consistently touch the spiritual lives of our children.

I encourage you beloved modern parents to go beyond the minimum standards of parenting to preparing your children for life as all-round productive adults, and transmitting cultural and Spiritual values.

Join me to pray; I thank you Abba father, for the gift of life and parents. Bless all parents with wisdom and strength to guide their children in your way and live a life of fulfillment. Amen


Seeking Help for Ukrainian Refugees






